DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



In reflecting on the past year that had so many uncertainties, I am proud of our resilience and how we adapted to continue to be there for our community. Despite limited funds, resources, and the impact of the global pandemic, we have made extraordinary progress and met various targets, with your support.

Here are some of the exciting things that our foundation worked on this past year:

- We contributed to the capacity building and development of 10 local women in our Mikocheni B community. Through our support, there has been a significant rise in businesses run and owned by marginalized local women, creating an increase in business income and in beneficiaries' household income.
- Through our programs, we created a better learning environment for 35 kindergarten students at Ushindi Primary School. Our meal and school supplies programs gave children from low-income families an opportunity to attend school, be attentive and succeed.
- We provided 14 local Tanzanian youth access to education, vocational training, and university support. Our education fund empowered our neighbourhood youth to embark on earning an income through employment or entrepreneurship.
- We reduced the level of poverty among 35 families supported in the Mikocheni B area by providing them with basic needs. Our accommodation allowance helped families avoid homelessness by having access to shelter and meals through our food drive campaigns.

I know that poverty reduction cannot be eliminated overnight but as we grow, we retain the lessons, tools, relationships and above all, resilience, to make positive changes, in close partnership with our community and local government.

Many thanks to our volunteers who have shown amazing dedication, continuing to give their time and energy to support our work.

Finally, I am in utmost gratitude to you, our donors, family, friends, and partners. You sustain the work we do and ensure that we can continue supporting the community members who need us most. Thanks to you, we continue to be true to our mission to restore the quality of life of low-income individuals and families in our neighbourhood by creating opportunities to improve their standards of living.

INCREASING OUR IMPACT

Basic needs, education and access to resources pose a huge barrier for some residents of Mikocheni B who have low or no income at all. Over the past year we had four main targets to support women, youth, children and families. We are pleased to report how our services made an impact and changed lives.

TARGET #1

To equip underprivileged women with loans, appropriate skills and capital to start or expand their small businesses in order to achieve financial security and create jobs for locals.

Outcome:

- 10 marginalized local women received loans to enhance their local business
- A deep freezer was provided to a widowed woman to help support and grow her business

TARGET #2

To reduce rate of unemployment and secondary school dropouts among youth by supporting them to successfully complete secondary school and/or vocational training.

Outcome:

- Two students completed secondary school
- Two students completed their Vocational Training
- One student graduated from the Teacher's College
- One student graduated with a bachelor's degree from the University of Dar es Salaam
- One student completed a Short Computer Course
- One student was supported with an allowance to get access to a tutor
- One student commenced studies at the Tanzania Institute of Accountancy (TIA)



INCREASING OUR IMPACT

TARGET #3

To support underprivileged school children attending Ushindi Primary School and Mikocheni Secondary School with supplies, meals, and enhancements to the school environment.

Outcome:

- Educational assistance to 35 primary and secondary students
- Enhancement of the kindergarten classroom environment
- 125 students of the Ushindi Primary School kindergarten and seven secondary school students were provided with midday meals over a period of three months

TARGET #4

To invest in strategic partnerships and services that ensure families have access to basic needs that allow children to go to school and excel while adults focus on developing themselves so they become financially selfsufficient.

Outcome:

- Our food drive and basic needs campaigns supported 42 underprivileged families of Mikocheni B
- Medical care was provided to three adults and two children
- Three families were provided with accommodation
- A water well was constructed with full functioning taps to serve 150 families

AMINA ANTHONY Small Business Owner

I am a small business owner, married and have four children. I keep myself busy working on my food business. Through Bouganvilla Community Foundation, I was able to get support that enabled me to grow my business significantly, to the point where I was able to increase my capital.

My business is seasonal and one of the challenges I face is losing some customers during the rainy season. This may discourage some small business owners like myself, but I would really like to advise them that if they stay committed it will eventually pay off. I am grateful that donors support the work of the Bouganvilla Community Foundation and I hope they continue, particularly the programs that focus on women, children and many others.

Since they opened their doors, the foundation has brought many positive changes in our neighbourhood, especially for new entrepreneurs and underprivileged households.



KHADIJA KASIM Small Business Owner

I have been receiving support from the Bouganvilla Community Foundation since 2018. I am married and have eight children, I have a small business selling food and snacks.

In the past I did not have capital to start any business and many days we would sleep with empty stomachs. This foundation has helped me raise capital and improve my family's standard of life. They also provide for my children by giving them school uniforms, school supplies and food while they are at school.

Giving does not cost millions. The little that people give really changes the lives of poor families. My family is a living example, a result of the contributions and donations that support the foundation's programs. It truly makes a difference.

Highschool Student


In 2018 I completed my Form Four education. I passed my exams but I was not fortunate enough to get the right grades to select the subject combination I wanted in order to enter Form Five.


SHARING OUR STORIES
